ORDINANCE NO. 98

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS, CHANGING THE NAME OF A PUBLIC STREET, TO-WIT: A PORTION OF DOOLEY ROAD TO BE KNOWN AS MIDWAY ROAD; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY:

WHEREAS, the City of Dallas and the City of Farmers Branch have changed the name of Dooley Road to Midway Road as that street traverses those cities and enters into the City of Addison, and,

WHEREAS, in order to maintain continuity in the street names within the area, the City Council of the City of Addison is of the opinion that it would be to the best interest of the citizens of the City to change the name of that portion of Dooley Road extending from the south corporate limits of the City north to its intersection with Belt Line Road to a new name, to-wit: Midway Road.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

Section 1: That the name of that portion of public street and roadway known as Dooley Road which extends from the south corporate limits of the City, north to its intersection with Belt Line Road, is hereby changed to Midway Road.

Section 2: If any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be held invalid or unconstitutional the remaining portion of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3: Whereas, there is a necessity for the street name change hereinabove set forth which creates an urgency and an emergency and in the interest of public safety and welfare requires that this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage as the law in such cases provides.
