

ORDINANCE NO. 131

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS, APPROVING CERTAIN RATE SCHEDULES FILED BY THE TEXAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY IN THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS, AND PROVIDING CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH SUCH RATE SCHEDULES MAY BE CHANGED, MODIFIED, AMENDED OR WITHDRAWN; ADOPTING RATE BOOK NO. B-72-21 FILED BY THE TEXAS POWER & LIGHT COMPANY AS A SCHEDULE OF RATES AND SERVICE REGULATIONS AUTHORIZED WITHIN THE CITY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Texas Power & Light Company Rate Book No. B-72-21, containing a set of electric rate schedules and the service regulations under which said Company is authorized to collect charges from its customers for the sale of electric power and energy within the Corporate limits of the City of Addison is hereby approved until such time as said rate schedules and service regulations may be changed, modified, amended or withdrawn, with the approval of the City Council. The rate schedules set out therein are subject, however, to the provisions of the Economic Stabilization Act of 1970, as amended, and the rules and regulations thereunder.

SECTION 2. Said Rate Book No. B-72-21, having been filed with the City Secretary of the City of Addison on December 28, 1971, is available in the office of the City Secretary as a public record for inspection at anytime during regular business hours and is adopted as Exhibit "A" to this Ordinance and is incorporated herein for all purposes.

SECTION 3. The filing of the rate schedules and service regulations with the City Secretary and the approval of the same by the City Council by this Ordinance shall constitute notice to all consumers of electricity within the City of Addison,

of the availability and application of such rate schedules and service regulations and the Company is authorized to collect charges according to such rate schedules subject to the provisions of Section 2 hereof.

SECTION 4. The fact that the Texas Power & Light Company provides electric power and energy within the Corporate limits of the City of Addison and the fact that such Company has shown it to be a necessity that a rate schedule increase be granted to continue its efficient production of electric power and energy creates an urgency and an emergency in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and requires that this Ordinance take effect immediately from and after its passage as the law in such cases provides.
