

ORDINANCE NO. 260

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 168, PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS ON APRIL 15, 1974, BY AMENDING SECTION 52 TO PROVIDE FOR NO PARKING AT ANY TIME ALONG THE SOUTH AND NORTH SIDE OF BROOKHAVEN CLUB DRIVE FROM SPRING VALLEY TO MARSH LANE AND ON THE NORTH SIDE OF CELESTIAL ROAD FOR A DISTANCE OF ONE HUNDRED FEET DUE EAST OF THE INTERSECTION OF NOEL AND CELESTIAL ROAD; PROVIDING FOR THE POSTING OF SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR REMOVAL OF VEHICLES IN VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City of Addison's Ordinance No. 168, passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Addison, Texas on April 15, 1974, is hereby amended to read as follows:

That Section 52 is hereby amended to provide: A. It shall be unlawful to park, stand or stop a motor vehicle at the following locations at any time:

<u>STREET NAME</u>	<u>PORTION OF STREET</u>
Brookhaven Club Drive	Between the north and south curb lines (or if none, the north and south edges of the roadway), of Brookhaven Club Drive from the intersection of Brookhaven Club Drive with the east line curb line of Marsh Lane to the intersection of Brookhaven Club Drive and the north curb line of Spring Valley Rd.

STREET NAME

PORTION OF STREET

Celestial Road

On the north curb line (or if none, the north edge of the roadway, of Celestial Road from the intersection of Celestial Road with the east curb line of Noel Road to a point one hundred feet due east of such intersection.

SECTION 2. The City Traffic Engineer is hereby directed and authorized to place appropriate signs at said location as to be clearly visible to the public.

SECTION 3. The Chief of Police or any other officer of the Police Department of the City of Addison shall be hereby directed and authorized to order removed or remove any vehicle parked in violation of this Ordinance, such violation being deemed injurious to health, safety and general welfare of the public within the City of Addison, Texas.

SECTION 4. All Ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the City Council that are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed except that this shall not affect the accepting, filing and prosecuting of cases for offenses occurring prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION 5. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Addison that the Sections, Paragraphs, Sentences, Clauses, and Phrases of this Ordinance are severable and if any Phrase, Clause, Sentence, Paragraph or Section hereof shall be declared unconstitutional, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining Phrases, Clauses, Sentences, Paragraphs or Sections of this Ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this Ordinance of any such unconsti-

tutional or invalid Phrase, Clause, Sentence, Paragraph or Section.

SECTION 6. Any person violating or failing to comply with any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined upon conviction not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

SECTION 7. The fact that the present Ordinances and Regulations of the City of Addison are inadequate to control the parking of vehicles within the corporate limits of the City of Addison, Texas, creates an emergency for the immediate preservation of public business, property, health, safety and general welfare of the public which requires that this Ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.
