

ORDINANCE NO. 398

AN ORDINANCE CALLING A SPECIAL CITY ELECTION, AT WHICH ELECTION, IF A MAJORITY OF THE QUALIFIED VOTERS VOTING IN SUCH ELECTION SHALL VOTE IN FAVOR OF THE ADOPTION OF THE PROPOSED CHARTER, IT SHALL THEN BECOME THE CHARTER GOVERNING ALL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON UNTIL AMENDED OR REPEALED.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. In accordance with the laws of the State of Texas a special election can be held on August 12, 1978, the same being the second Saturday of said month, in the City of Addison for the purpose of having the qualified voters pass on the proposition, "For the Adoption of the Charter," and "Against the Adoption of the Charter."

SECTION 2. The polling place for said election shall be the Addison Fire Department, located at 4500 Belt Line Road, in Election Precinct No. 173 with Virginia Page as Presiding Judge, and Phyllis Covington as Alternate Presiding Judge. The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two nor more than three qualified clerks to serve and assist in holding said election; provided that if the Presiding Judge herein appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of the clerks. The polls at the above designated polling place shall on election day be open from 7 o'clock a.m. to 7 o'clock p.m.

SECTION 3. The absentee voting for the above designated election shall be held at the Office of the City Secretary, 4500

Belt Line Road, P.O. Box 144, Addison, Texas, said place of absentee voting shall remain open for at least eight hours on each day for absentee voting which is not a Saturday, a Sunday, or an official holiday, beginning on the 20th day and continuing through the 4th day preceding the date of said election. Said place of voting shall remain open between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. on each day for said absentee voting. The above described place for absentee voting is also the absentee's clerk's mailing address to which ballot applications and ballots voted by mail may be sent. Absentee voting, both by personal appearance and by mail, shall be by paper ballots and shall be canvassed by a special canvassing board, and Virginia Page, as Presiding Judge, Phyllis Covington, as Alternate Presiding Judge, and one appointed clerk will serve as the Special Canvassing Board for said election.

SECTION 4. That said election shall be held in accordance with the Election Code of this State and only resident qualified voters of said City shall be eligible to vote at said election.

SECTION 5. Notice of said election will be given in accordance with the terms and provisions of Article 4.05 of the Election Code and Art. 29e and the City Secretary is hereby instructed to have said notice posted and published in accordance with said Articles 5.04 and 29e.

SECTION 6. That immediately after said election is held, the officers holding the same shall make returns of the result thereof to the Mayor of this City as required by the Election Code of this State.

SECTION 7. A copy of this Ordinance shall also serve as a

writ of election which shall be delivered to the above appointed
Presiding Judge, for said election.
