

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 168, PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS, ON APRIL 15, 1974, BY AMENDING SAID ORDINANCE TO ADD SECTION 54 TO PROVIDE FOR TRUCK ROUTES AT THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED ROADS DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR THE POSTING OF SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR A REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City of Addison's Ordinance No. 168, passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Addison, Texas, on April 15, 1974, be, and the same is hereby amended to add Section 54 to read as follows:

Section 54. TRUCK ROUTES

A. No person shall operate, push, pull or tow a motor vehicle or trailer with a manufacturer's weight or rated carrying capacity in excess of 3/4 ton on the following described roads:

<u>STREET</u>	<u>EXTENT</u>
1. Marsh Lane	From the south city limits to the south right-of-way line of Belt Line Road and being the 13900 block through the 15000 block.
2. Brookhaven Club Drive	From the east right-of-way line of Marsh Lane to the south right-of-way line of Spring Valley and being the 3700 block through the 4100 block of Brookhaven Club Drive.
3. Spring Valley	Between the west city limits and the east city limits and being the 3700 block through the 4100 block of Spring Valley.

B. This section of the ordinance shall not forbid deliveries of any type of commercial vehicle in the course of serving businesses on the above designated streets but shall apply only to through truck traffic on said streets.

SECTION 2. The City Traffic Engineer is hereby directed and authorized to place appropriate signs at said location as to be clearly visible to the public.

SECTION 3. All ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the City Council that are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed except that this shall not affect the accepting, filing and prosecuting of cases for offenses occurring prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Addison that the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases of this ordinance are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence or paragraph or section hereof shall be declared unconstitutional, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs or sections of this ordinance since the same would have not been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

SECTION 5. Any person violating or failing to comply with any provision of this Ordinance shall be fined upon conviction not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

SECTION 6. The fact that the present ordinance and regulations of the City of Addison are inadequate to control through truck traffic within the corporate limits of the City of Addison, Texas, creates an

emergency for the immediate preservation of public business, property, health, safety and general welfare of the public which requires that this Ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.
