ORDINANCE NO. <u>536</u>

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 261, PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS, ON APRIL 27, 1976, BY AMENDING SECTION XVI-F GENERAL REQUIREMENTS-MISCELLANEOUS, TO ADD NO. 7 TO PROVIDE PAVEMENT MARKINGS; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICT-ING ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City of Addison's Ordinance No. 261, passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Addison, Texas, on April 27, 1976, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section XVI - General Requirements

- F. Miscellaneous
 - 7. Before any street is opened to traffic in the City of Addison all necessary pavement markings necessary to comply to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for streets and highways shall be completed. All work must first have the approval of the Public Works Department.

SECTION 2. All Ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the City Council that are in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed except that this shall not affect the accepting, filing, prosecuting of cases for offenses occuring prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 3. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be

unconstitutional, illegal, or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional, and shall not affect the validity of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance as a whole.

SECTION 4. That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of this ordinance shall be subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance of the City as heretofore amended, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each offense and that each day such violation shall continue to exist shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 5. The fact that the present ordinances and regulations of the city are inadequate to properly safeguard the health, safety, morals, peace and general welfare of the inhabitants of the city creates an emergency for the immediate preservation of the public business, property, health, safety and general welfare of the public which requires that this ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its passage, as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.
