ORDINANCE NO. <u>675</u>

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 502, PASSED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS, ON THE 8th DAY OF MAY, 1979, BY AMENDING SECTION 30. TO DELETE MARSH LANE; BY AMENDING SECTION 31. TO ADD MARSH LANE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEAL CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR THE POSTING OF SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City of Addison's Ordinance No. 502, passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Addison, Texas, on May 8, 1979, is hereby amended to amend Section 30 to read as follows:

> That Section 30. Speeds Greater than thirty-five miles per hour (35 mph) on designated streets not reasonable nor prudent.

Street	Extent
1. Spring Valley	Between Midway Road and Marsh Lane and being the 3600 block through the 4100 block of Spring Valley Road.

SECTION 2. That Section 31. Speeds greater than forty miles per hour (40 mph) on designated streets not reasonable nor prudent, is hereby amended to add the following:

Street	Extent
1. Marsh Lane	From the south city limits to the south right-of-way line of Belt Line Road and being the 13900 block through the 15000 block.

SECTION 3. That the City Traffic Engineer is hereby directed and authorized to place appropriate signs at said locations to be

clearly visible to the public.

SECTION 4. All ordinances heretofore passed and approved by the City Council that are in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed except that this shall not affect the accepting, filing, and prosecuting of cases for offense occurring prior to the effective date of this ordinance.

SECTION 5. It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council of the City of Addison that the Section, Paragraphs, Sentences, Clauses, and Phrases of this ordinance are severable and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section hereof shall be declared unconstitutional; such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, or section of this ordinance since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this ordinance of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section.

SECTION 6. Any person violating or failing to comply with any provisions of this ordinance shall be fined upon conviction not less than One Dollar (\$1.00) nor more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).

SECTION 7. The fact that the present ordinances and regulations of the City of Addison are inadequate to control the parking of vehicles within the corporate limits of the City of Addison, Texas, creates an emergency for the immediate preservation of public business, property, health, safety, and general welfare of the public which requires that this ordinance shall become effective from and after the date of its passage as provided by law, and it is accordingly so ordained.
