

ORDINANCE NO. 085-054

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ADDISON, TEXAS, CALLING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD WITHIN THE TOWN, MAKING PROVISIONS FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION AND OTHER PROVISIONS INCIDENT AND RELATED TO THE PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE

COUNTY OF DALLAS
TOWN OF ADDISON

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WHEREAS, the City Council of the Town of Addison has determined that an election should forthwith be called and held in the Town for the purpose of submitting certain propositions for the issuance of bonds for the purposes hereinafter set forth; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds and declares that the meeting at which this Ordinance is considered is open to the public as required by law, and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by Article 6252-17, V.T.C.S.;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ADDISON, TEXAS:

1. That an election shall be held in and throughout the Town of Addison, Texas, on the 14th day of September, 1985, which date is not less than fifteen (15) nor more than ninety (90) days from the date of this Ordinance, at which election the following propositions shall be submitted:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

"Shall the City Council of the Town of Addison, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the Town in the amount of \$4,000,000, maturing serially in such installments as may be fixed by the City Council, the maximum maturity being not more than forty (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance, for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: acquiring, constructing, improving and equipping of a recreation center and to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

PROPOSITION NO. 2

"Shall the City Council of the Town of Addison, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the Town in the amount of \$1,100,000, maturing serially in such installments as may be fixed by the City Council, the maximum maturity being not more than forty (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance, for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: acquiring, constructing, improving and equipping of a municipal service center, including the acquisition of sites therefor, and to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

PROPOSITION NO. 3

"Shall the City Council of the Town of Addison, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the Town in the amount of \$9,490,000, maturing serially in such installments as may be fixed by the City Council, the maximum maturity being not more than forty (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance, for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: constructing improvements to, and extending and expanding the streets, thoroughfares, sidewalks and other public ways of the Town, including related storm drainage facilities and improvements and traffic signalization and the acquisition of any needed right-of-way therefor, and to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

PROPOSITION NO. 4

"Shall the City Council of the Town of Addison, Texas, be authorized to issue general obligation bonds of the Town in the amount of \$500,000, maturing serially in such installments as may be fixed by the City Council, the maximum maturity being not more than forty (40) years from their date, to be issued and sold at any price or prices and to bear interest at any rate or rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council at the time of issuance, for the purpose of providing funds for permanent public improvements, to-wit: acquiring and improving land for park purposes in and for the Town, and to provide for the payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds by levying a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on and to create a sinking fund sufficient to redeem said bonds as they become due?"

2. That the entire Town of Addison shall constitute one election precinct for said election and the Central Fire Station located at 4799 Airport Parkway, Addison, Texas, is hereby designated as the polling place.

Said polling place shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on the date of the election. The Presiding Judge herein appointed shall appoint not less than two (2) nor more than four (4) qualified election clerks to serve and assist in the conduct of said election, provided that if the Presiding Judge named above actually serves as expected, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall be one of such clerks.

By approving and signing this Ordinance, the Mayor of said Town officially confirms his appointment of the following election officers:

Mary Dolan, Presiding Judge
Martha Duncan, Alternate Presiding Judge

By passing this Ordinance the City Council of said Town approves and concurs in the appointment of the aforesaid election officers.

A public school of instruction shall be held and notice therefor shall be given, all in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, as amended.

3. That voting at and on the date of said election, and absentee voting therefor, shall be by the use of a lawfully approved electronic voting system. The preparation of voting equipment to be used in connection with said electronic voting system and the official ballots for said election shall conform to the Texas Election Code, as amended, so as to permit the electors to vote "For" or "Against" the aforesaid Propositions, with the ballots for said electronic voting system to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such Propositions to be expressed substantially as follows:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION
RECREATION CENTER BONDS

PROPOSITION NO. 2

THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,100,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION
MUNICIPAL SERVICE CENTER BONDS

PROPOSITION NO. 3

THE ISSUANCE OF \$9,490,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION
STREET IMPROVEMENT BONDS

PROPOSITION NO. 4

THE ISSUANCE OF \$500,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION
PARK BONDS

4. Absentee voting shall be conducted by the City Secretary, who is hereby appointed the Clerk of Absentee Voting, at the City Secretary's office in the Town Hall Addison, Texas, and the City Secretary shall canvass the absentee ballots. For the period absentee voting for said election is permitted by law, the Clerk shall keep said office open for absentee voting during regular hours on each day except Saturday, Sunday and official State holidays. The absentee ballots for said election shall conform to the requirements of the Texas Election Code, as amended, and so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" each of the aforesaid Propositions.

5. All resident, qualified electors of the Town shall be permitted to vote at said election. In addition, the election materials enumerated in the Texas Election Code, as amended, shall be printed in both English and Spanish for use at the polling places and for absentee voting for said election.

6. That the holding of the election herein ordered shall be in compliance with the Texas Election Code, as amended, except as modified by other applicable provisions of law.

7. The above named election officer(s) shall make returns of the election to the City Council and the ballot boxes shall be delivered to the custody of the City Council in compliance with the applicable laws of the State of Texas; and the ballots properly marked in conformance with the provisions of the Texas Election Code, as amended, for votes cast both during the period of absentee voting and during the election herein ordered, shall be counted in the manner required by law.

8. That notice of said election shall be given by posting a notice containing a substantial copy of this Ordinance at three (3) public places within the Town and also at the Town Hall not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date upon which said election is to be held, and by publication of said notice on the same day in each of two (2) successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published within said Town, the date of the first publication to be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date set for said election.
