ORDINANCE NO. 087-057

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF ADDISON, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 18, UTILITIES OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, TOWN OF ADDISON, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR SEWAGE RATES; PROVIDING FOR WATER RATES; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF ADDISON,
TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances, Town of Addison, Texas, is hereby amended by amending Sec. 18-76 to read as follows:

Sec. 18-86. Sewage Rates. The sewage rates for the Town of Addison shall be as follows:

This section shall become effective as of October 15, 1987

SECTION 2. That Chapter 18 of the Code of Ordinances, Town of Addison, Texas, is hereby amended by amending Sec. 18-77 to read as follows:

Sec. 18-77. Water Rates. The water rates for the Town of Addison will be as follows:

Commercial, industrial, retail, single-family and multifamily customers, per 1,000 gallons of water used \$ 1.54

SECTION 3. That should any paragraph, sentence, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or be held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal, or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. That all ordinances of the City in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed and all other ordinances of the City not in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 5. Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be punished by a penalty of fine only not to exceed the sum of Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00) for each offense, and each and every day such offense is continued shall constitute a new and separate offense.

SECTION 6. The fact that the present code of Ordinances does not provide for certain utility rates and is therefore, inadequate to properly safeguard the general public health and safety, creates an emergency and an imperative public necessity, and the ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption.
